

Pearson College UWC to Host Race Rocks Swim Challenge

International and Canadian students to brave Pedder Bay waters for marathon swim on Mother's Day.

Metchosin, B.C., 4 May 2023 - Pearson College UWC is proud to host the Race Rocks Challenge on Sunday, May 14 -- Mother's Day -- that will see up to seven students swim 6.5 km in open water from the Race Rocks Island jetty to the main College dock on Pedder Bay.

"I can't wait for the Race Rocks challenge" says Cedric Torres, lead organizer and Seafront Support and Activities Facilitator. "This event is a great opportunity for students to work towards a one-of-a-kind goal made possible by our waterfront infrastructure. What a way to celebrate and showcase the resilience and determination of our participants."

The Challenge will feature seven students from Canada, Ireland, Costa Rica, the United States and Turkey who have been training since late last year in both the campus pool and in the chilly water of Pedder Bay.

"We've put in hundreds of hours of our time into training all for it to boil down to one three-hour swim," says participant Grace Goudie, originally from Newfoundland and Labrador. "Soon, we will learn whether our training was enough to achieve such a big goal. Soon, the idea of 6.5 kilometres in the Pacific Ocean will become a memory, not a looming achievement on the horizon. And soon, my teammates and I will be able to say that we completed the Race Rocks Swim Challenge!"

This will be the first post-pandemic Race Rocks Challenge and students, houseparent's, staff, faculty, and alumni will be out to cheer on the swimmers and help raise funds for those affected by the recent Syria/Turkey earthquake.
