The North American Indigenous Games is a significant sporting event that brings together Indigenous youth from across North America to celebrate culture, heritage, and athletic talent. It serves as a platform for young Indigenous athletes to showcase their skills, build connections, and foster a sense of pride and community.

Nathaniel has demonstrated exceptional dedication and determination in his athletic pursuits, and his selection to represent British Columbia is a testament to his hard work and commitment. During the school year, he has also served as a key leader to his classmates, participating in many Indigenous-led activities both on and off-campus.
