B.C. Sen. Yuen Pau Woo Speaks at Pearson Tomorrow An Ongoing Series -- Global Affairs @ Pearson College UWC

VICTORIA, B.C. — British Columbia's recently-appointed senator Yuen Pau Woo will speak to students and the public at **tomorrow's** Pearson College UWC Global Affairs presentation.

Born in Malaysia and raised in Singapore, Woo is a 1981 (Year 6) graduate of Pearson who attended the unique Victoria-area school on a scholarship – like the majority of the 160 current students from across Canada and around the world.

Over three decades, Woo has worked on public policy issues across Canada with an emphasis on relations with Asia, and has been a spokesperson for B.C. and Canada in the Asia Pacific realm. Currently Senior Fellow in public policy at the UBC Asian Institute of Research and a Senior Resident Fellow at the SFU Beedie School of Business, he operates a consulting firm and is president of HQ Vancouver, a public-private partnership promoting B.C. as a head office location for global firms. Woo has also served on advisory councils, boards and committees, working on a variety of issues such as immigration, multiculturalism, economic policy and Canada's place in the world.
