Who: Janet Rogers is a Mohawk/Tuscarora writer from Six Nations. Janet works in the genres of poetry, spoken word performance poetry, video poetry and recorded poetry with music and is a radio broadcaster, documentary producer, media and sound artist.

Chaw-win-is Ogilvie is a member of both Tla-o-qui-aht and Cheklesaht nations of the

Nuu-chah-nulth people. She is a Sessional Instructor at the University of Victoria, delivering culturally relevant Life Skills Programs to individuals and families living in Siem Lelum, ly Len Hautw and Cedarhouse.

Philip Kevin Paul is a member of the WSÁ,NEC Nation and a renowned author. His work has been published in BC Studies, Literary Review of Canada, Breathing Fire: Canada's New Poets and An Anthology of Canadian Native Literature in English. Paul has also worked with the University of Victoria's linguistics department to ensure the preservation of the SENCOTEN language.
