BASIC COST

A place at Pearson College includes room, board, and tuition. Scholarships available after means testing process, completed by the National Committee.

TRAVEL EXPENSES

The student or the National Committee is responsible for transportation to and from the College (one round trip to the College each year) and for arrangements during winter break. In cases of need, the National Committee must request travel assistance from Pearson College directly at the time of nomination. Limited funding is available for such expenses.

Canadian Visa or Study Permit (if applicable, estimate only)	\$ 150

Project Weeks (2 @ \$200 to 400 each), yearly	\$ 400 to 800
Winter Break (if staying locally), yearly	\$ 200 to 300

Some students may need to buy clothes suitable to the climate, such as raingear, and buy personal items for some activities, such as a wetsuit for diving, sailing or kayaking. Wetsuits currently cost \$100, and there are some available for a nominal rent.

OPTIONAL EXPENSES

During their two years at Pearson College, many students want to travel to the United States. We suggest that students obtain a U.S. visitor's visa from the U.S. Embassy in their country before traveling to the College.

University applications and testing costs can be expensive, ranging from \$100 for the United Kingdom to \$400 in North America.

In some countries, the International Baccalaureate Diploma requires legalization (\$150).
